



Fishing Report for week of 03 to 10 October, 2004

Weather: Hi 10C; Lo -2C. Mixed bag to start the week. Cloud and rain to finish the week.

We had a busy week for our standards with many guests spending part of the week. We had 7 repeat clients returning to spend a week in our steelhead paradise. We fished with maximum of 6 anglers on any one day. River levels were on the drop and the fishing conditions were quite good to start the week. Multiple fish days on the Bell Irving were enjoyed by many of the guests during the first two days. The conditions on the Bell were not favorable mid week. We were back to hooking fish on the last two days of the week on the Bell.

The mainstem Nass was now prime for floating as water conditions were quite favorable. We landed a few fish on this section of river, but not quite the bonanza we had enjoyed in past seasons at this time of the year. Due to the unusually high water levels recently, many of the fish had moved up into smaller tribs.

We fished the Meziadin river with very good success this week, landing fish each day we made the one hour journey south. We fished the Damdochax River with excellent water conditions and good success having multiple fish days on a number of occasions. We fished the Tahltan River to the north and are very interested in looking at doing more exploration in this area of the Stikine watershed. We also fished the Bear River with excellent success for bright fresh coho salmon.

Many of the guests had a chance to fish 5 different rivers this week. Although water conditions were not good, we landed steelhead everyday. We hooked over 40 steelhead and caught many trout and Coho.
